1509	25/04/2022	Orient Road Lancing	A wallet and gym bag were stolen from a vehicle. No damage was caused to the vehicle.

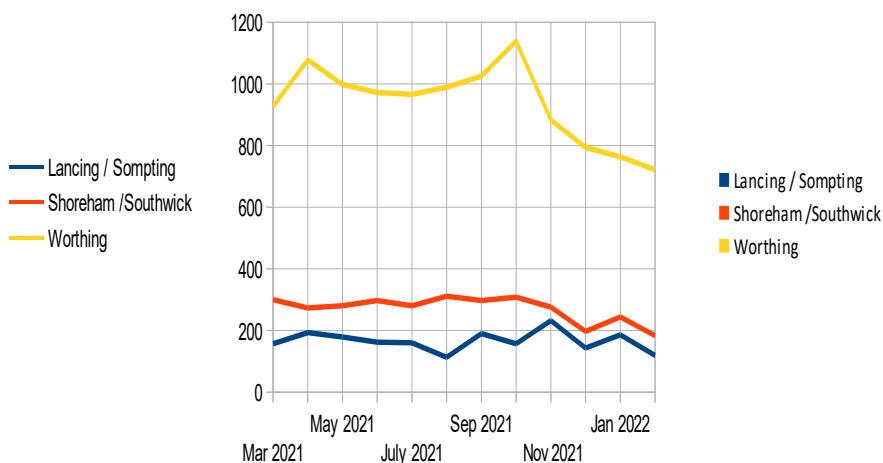
## Revisions to the Halewick Lane Battery Storage

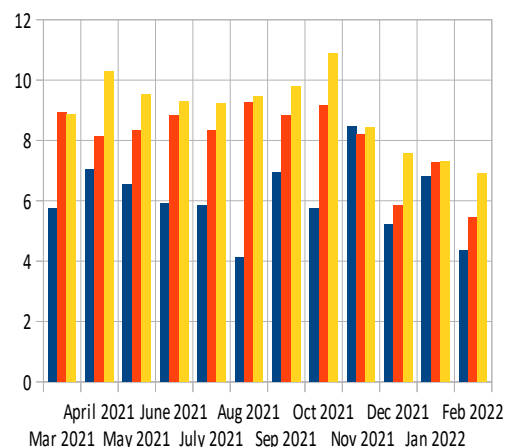

## Stay safe when saving on energy bills
